The literacy rate in Pakistan is at an average 60% across the country. Polio eradication is Rotary's top priority since it spearheaded the Global Polio Eradication Initiative (GPEI) in 1988. Pakistan National PolioPlus Committee, Rotary International in collaboration with UNICEF Pakistan ordered 5000 Speaking Books titled "A Story of Health" to reach out to districts and towns where literacy is at its lowest.

The 5000 speaking books are bilingual. The majority of Pushtun speaking population fear polio vaccine as harmful and against religious norms. A Story of Health facilitated to dispel many myths and misconceptions, created awareness not only the importance of polio vaccine but on issues related to clean drinking water, hygiene, sanitation and environment.

In 2014, the number of polio cases in Pakistan had spiraled to 306 WPV cases. Today, with continuous sessions in village schools and deprived communities in all the four provinces of Pakistan, our effort has borne fruit. In 2018, to-date we have not received a single polio and we hope 'to achieve 'zero' case this year.
